Travel Fellowships to ICTAM2012

The U.S. National Committee on Theoretical and Applied Mechanics (USNC/TAM) announces that a limited number of travel fellowships will be available for those presenting papers at the 23nd International Congress on Theoretical and Applied Mechanics (http://www.ictam2012.org/) to be held in Beijing, China, August 19-24, 2012.

In order to be eligible for a fellowship, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1) U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- 2) Presenting author (or co-author) of a paper accepted by the ICTAM2012 International Papers Committee

The ranking of the applications will be based on the quality of the abstract and the two-page short paper required by ICTAM2012. (See http://www.ictam2012.org/ for details) Preference will be given to students and early career faculty.

Eligible individuals who have submitted a paper for consideration to ICTAM2012 may submit an application for a USNC/TAM travel fellowship. An application form for the fellowship can be found on the web site: http://www.usnctam.org. The application form, paper abstract, and two-page short paper must be submitted electronically using the procedure indicated on the USNC/TAM web site. **The deadline for receipt of applications is January 31, 2012.**

Decisions regarding fellowships will be announced after final decisions on paper acceptances are made by ICTAM2012 (~ end of May 2012). Each fellowship recipient will pay for his or her own travel expenses and registration. The awards will be made before the congress upon confirmation of acceptance of the fellowship. Within two months after the congress, awardees will provide a trip report of their activities at the congress. The trip report will summarize their view of how they benefited from attending the congress, and their general impression of the congress.
